Worth the Wait

Reflecting on my years at Falling Spring, many memories come to mind. One of my favorites involves sitting outside at the Manse, with Bill and Linda Harter, to watch "the show." This miraculous event took place each summer evening,

whether or not anyone stopped to notice. The price of admission was a willingness to watch and wait. In a world of digital swipes, next buttons, and skipping through YouTube videos, watching and waiting for the evening primrose flowers to burst open was an invitation to slow down, savor the moment, and become aware of the beauty around us.

Spring has sprung, and new life is blossoming abundantly. Have you noticed the flowers, listened to the birds, or smelled the blossoms? This invitation to slow down and savor the beauty around us is wonderful in its own right, but it also encourages us to go deeper. Behind the creation is the Creator, Who invites us to watch and wait. "Be still, and know that I am God." (Psalm 46:10). God is moving and working all around us. Are watching and waiting long enough to see and experience it?

Pastor Andy and I recently preached a series on the journey of Moses and the Israelites out of Egypt. In Exodus 14:13-14, Moses tells the people, "Do not be afraid. Stand firm and you will see the deliverance the Lord will bring you today. The Egyptians you see today you will never see again. The Lord will fight for you; you need only to be still." Reflecting on this passage makes me wonder what it might have been like to be in the Israelite camp on that day long ago. They were trapped between the sea, the desert, and the full force of Egypt's army. There was much to fear. Then God performed a miracle by parting the sea. Although it might seem absurd that anyone could have missed something so marvelous, I wondered aloud if some may have missed the beginning stages of this miracle because they were distracted by the difficulties of their situation.

This brings us back to the deeper invitation of Spring - to watch and wait, not only for the new life of the season, but for how the Lord is moving, working, and speaking in our midst. Life has a way of becoming busy and noisy, so let this be our invitation - be still, watch, and wait. Henri Nouwen writes, "underneath all these often very noisy voices is a still, small voice that says, 'You are my Beloved, my favor rests on you.' That's the voice we need most of all to hear. To hear that voice, however, requires special effort; it requires solitude, silence, and a strong determination to listen. That's what prayer is. It is listening to the voice that calls us 'my Beloved.'"¹

The following is an update of actions taken at the February session meeting:

- Elders approved a congregational meeting to be held on Sunday, April 28th for the purpose of electing Trustees.

Trustees are members of the congregation who serve through overseeing the physical properties and gifts to and of the parish.

- The following were approved for the positions of Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, and Clerk of Session: Paul Luka as Treasurer, Dave Mummert as Assistant Treasurer, and Cheri Kearney as Clerk of Session.

- Each elder received an updated copy of the Book of Order, which contains the Foundations, the Form of Government, the Directory for Worship, and the Church Discipline. As Christians, we are in a continuous process of growth in relationship with God, each other, and self. This is especially true of those who have been called to service in the ordered ministries of the church. The Book of Order provides the guidance for these roles.

- All staff and elders were provided the opportunity to participate in Boundary Training through the Presbytery of Carlisle. The training was presented by Rev David C. Olsen, PhD, LCSW, LMFT who is both an ordained pastor and a practicing psychologist. Some of focus areas discussed were: The Burn Out Factor, We all violate boundaries, Putting the problem in context: Ministry is different then other professions, Why are Healthy Boundaries so Hard to Sustain?, System Contributions to Boundary Problems, Moving towards Prevention and Creativity, Prevention and Assessment, and Building more differentiated leadership as the key to healthy boundaries.

- Elders met with and interviewed confirmation candidates on Sunday, March 10.
