The Felders in Kenya

Dear Praying Friends,

It's been a while since our last update. Life has been typically hectic. Amanda and the two younger kids spent the first half of December with her family in Pennsylvania before we all came together in Houston to celebrate Christmas with my parents and my brother's family.

Matthew (19) continues studying computer science as a sophomore at Rice University. He is involved with Intervarsity and the rocket club. Matthew spent the summer shoveling mulch and living with his grandparents in Chambersburg, PA.

Aaron (17) is a junior and shares his brother's interest in computer science. He has just started looking at colleges. Aaron participated in the Kenyan national chess tournament, which included the cross-cultural experience of staying at a boarding school with thousands of other competitors.

Anna (13) is in eighth-grade, played three sports this year (and cringes at her father's voluble exhortations from the bleachers), and was a class officer.

Amanda continues to lead the counseling service at Rift Valley Academy, amongst other duties like sponsoring Anna's class. She benefits from a very collegial relationship with another counselor. Amanda was excited this year that the packing to return to Kenya finished a whole hour before departing for the airport – a new record.

I (**Jon**) continue to balance clinical duties with the work of African Mission Healthcare. This year involved less travel than typical, which was nice. In February, I did go to Uganda to visit the new 45-bed maternity under construction and due to open early next year. My long-time friend and colleague Kenneth Miriti and I were to journey to the Nuba Mountains of Sudan in October, but heavy rains washed out the road. Now I plan to go in February when a team from Kijabe Hospital in Kenya will conduct an AMH-sponsored training program to reduce maternal mortality.

Another highlight (?) was that I vanquished a second bat (picture not shown, but available upon request). This time, we don't know how the critter got into the house. Amanda just saw it flying around downstairs one morning. Our house is next to the forest, the likely source of the uninvited guest. Our hope that it had been chased away was misplaced as it resurfaced that night. After the previous encounter, I knew what was needed:

Hoodie

N95 mask, left over from Covid

My regular armor-plated glasses

Triple gloves, also left over from Covid

Tennis racket

Half bottle of Doom (like Raid)

Rabies boosters for everyone, since we didn't want to take any chances

The rest can be left to your comical imagination. This time, my heart rate achieved only 80% of maximum.

Seriously, rabies is no joke in Kenya. This year I was consulted about two cases at different hospitals

(from dogs, not bats).

As always, we are incredibly grateful to our ministry partners who help our family fulfill Christ's calling to serve in Africa. This year marked 20 years on the ground in Africa. We enjoyed visits from supporters and love the opportunity to share about the ministry.

Information on Receiving Church Emails

Falling Spring has two email lists: Prayer Chain and Weekly Updates. Prayer Chain emails are sent as more emergent requests are received, inviting those on the Prayer Chain to pray. Weekly Updates emails contain weekly announcements, the prayer list, information about upcoming Sunday worship services, and anything else we feel would be helpful for you to know. Anyone can sign up to receive these emails. If you would like to sign up, you can...

- Go to <u>pcfallingspring.org</u>, scroll down the homepage and click "Join the Prayer Chain," "Sign up for weekly updates," or both if you want to be on both lists.
- Go to Church Center (app or web). On the Home tab, click "Join our prayer chain,"
 "Join our email list," or both if you want to be on both lists.

We've received requests from a number of people who signed up, but aren't receiving emails from us. Below are the most likely reasons and their solutions.

PROBLEM: Someone isn't on the email lists because they didn't sign up. SOLUTION: See the two bullet points above for instructions on how to sign up. (Please note: Signing up for one does not automatically sign you up for the other. If you want to receive both Prayer Chain and Weekly Updates, you will need to sign up for each one.)

PROBLEM: Someone is on the list, but our emails are going to their junk folder. SOLUTION: Check your junk/spam/promotions folders. Add brad@pcfallingspring.org to your address book. There are also ways to whitelist @pcfallingspring.org with your email provider (e.g. Gmail).

PROBLEM: Someone used to receive emails, but accidentally clicked the unsubscribe link. SOLUTION: Go to the Resources page of our website. Under "Stay Connected," click either/both of the following: "Re-subscribe to Prayer Chain" and/or "Re-subscribe to Weekly Updates."

(Note: We cannot re-subscribe people on our end due to spamming regulations.)

PROBLEM: Someone isn't receiving emails because of an incorrect or old email address. SOLUTION: Update your email address on Church Center by following the Church Center guide on the <u>resources page</u> of our website, or by contacting the church office to ensure your email address is correct.
