

# Views From a Hill CRE Update


Crazy Ranting Elephants...Cracked Rotten Eggs...Cats Running
Everywhere. What does CRE stand for again? Ahh yes, Commissioned
Ruling Elder. As many of you know, I have been pursuing the process of becoming a CRE
for the past several years. This journey began shortly after we found ourselves going from
two pastors to one, and my call was clear: Support Pastor Andy and help Falling Spring
grow and thrive through change. As I approach the conclusion of this journey, there are no
full-time pastors at Falling Spring, and my call remains clear - help our church grow and
thrive through seasons of change.

On April 17, I met with the Committee on Preparation for Ministry (CPM) to preach a sermon and answer lots of questions. It went well, and they unanimously attested that I have completed the CRE requirements. Furthermore, they expressed confidence that I am equipped and ready to serve as a CRE. What happens from here?

We will draft a Covenant of Agreement, and representatives from the Committee on Ministry (COM) will conduct a Fit Interview with me and several members of Session. If the way be clear with COM, I will be commissioned as a CRE at Falling Spring in the near future. At this point, we should note that this is a unique situation, because I have been serving full-time at Falling Spring for almost twenty-five years. Let's be clear that I am not being re-hired, but rather authorized to perform certain duties typically assigned to ordained pastors, such as baptisms and weddings. This is important to me, because it will help Falling Spring provide essential ministries to the people God entrusts to our church family. What a blessing to witness someone's baptism, be a part of their faith journey growing up, and then participate in their wedding!

As I write this, I am in the last week of my last seminary class, Foundations of Christian Education. It has been my favorite class, with a winning combination of brain research, emphasis on contemplation, and practical applications to teaching effectively. Thank you for your prayers and encouragement throughout this process. I plan to finish strong and look forward to continued ministry at Falling Spring!
