There are so many ways that we can care for and encourage one another. The Scripture tells us in 1 Thessalonians 5:11, "Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing." 

Update From Your Pastoral Nominating Committee

On August 24, 2025, your PNC (Pastoral Nominating Committee) was authorized by the congregation to begin the process of calling a new Pastor to the Presbyterian Church of Falling Spring.

Members of the committee have met on 8/25, 9/2, 9/4, 9/8, and 9/15, to create the information to help "call" pastoral candidates from the database of candidates within our denomination. Being "called" to a location does not just mean employed in a job. Rather, it implies that the applicant uses their discernment, guided by the Holy Spirit, to consider where the Kingdom of God may be strengthened by their spiritual gifts.

Our first step in this process is to complete a Ministerial Discernment Profile (MDP). This includes information about the church and congregation, duties and desired traits of a prospective Head Pastor, and narrative responses about the ministries of this church. At the time of this update, we are completing the draft of our MDP, which then will be approved by our session and the Carlisle Presbytery's Committee on Ministry. It may then appear in the database to be viewed by and matched with prospective candidates.

Know that we are prayerfully completing each step in this endeavor. We also rely on the Holy Spirit to guide us in this process. We solicit your prayers that the right pastor for our congregation will be "called". Also, please pray for us, your PNC. It will truly make a difference! We are open to general questions that do not breach any confidentiality that is required. We hope that you will understand that we cannot discuss many details of our work such as specific information in the MDP, dates, or names of prospective candidates.

It is our goal that we will report in person to the congregation in person every 6 weeks over the coming months. Thank you in advance for your patience as we represent you, our friends and family of faith.
