### Views From a Hill

Every December, our hearts are drawn toward home. We decorate our living rooms, hang stockings, and set extra places at our tables for loved ones who come home for Christmas. There's something deep within us that longs for the warmth, belonging, and peace that the word home represents.

It's no accident that this longing is stirred most deeply during the season when we celebrate the Incarnation — the moment when the eternal Son of God left His heavenly home for His earthly home. John says it this way: "The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us" (John 1:14). The Greek word for "dwelling" literally means "to pitch a tent" or "to tabernacle." In a surprising and marvelous act, God moved into our neighborhood.

What a wonder! The One who spoke galaxies into being chose to be born in a borrowed stable, to rest on straw instead of a throne. The Son left His home so that we might one day find ours.

In Jesus, God made His home on earth — not in splendor or power, but in humility and love. He stepped into our world of cold nights and crowded inns, of joy and sorrow, of laughter and loss.

Thankfully, the story doesn't end in Bethlehem. The wonder of Christmas reaches all the way to the present. Jesus promised, "If anyone loves Me... My Father will love him, and We will come to him and make Our home with him" (John 14:23). The God who once dwelled in a manger now dwells in the hearts of all who believe.

One day, the story will come full circle. Near the end of the book of Revelation, we find a promise: "And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Look! God's dwelling place is now among the people, and he will dwell with them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God." (Revelation 21:3). Home, at last. No more goodbyes, no more distance, no more longing — just the eternal joy of being with God, forever at home.

So this December, as you hang lights, bake cookies, and welcome those who walk through your door, remember the deeper story these traditions tell. The Son left His home to bring us home. The cradle leads to the cross, the cross to the empty tomb, and the empty tomb to an open door — the door of God's eternal home.

May your heart be warmed this Christmas by the One who still whispers, "Behold, I stand at the door and knock." And may you know the peace and wonder of being truly home in Him. Much love,

Let's open our eyes to ways we can reach out intentionally to provide comfort and help. Yes, Christmas can be complicated. Yet, it can be singularly, peacefully simple because it is all about the birth of Jesus.

Whether your Christmas celebration is small or large, whether your house is quiet or chaotic, Jesus is there. He is Immanuel. He is 'God with us.' He is 'God with you.' 


# WHAT WE ARE LEARNING

# **Food Pantry Update**

On November 18, our Food Pantry gave out 90 vouchers for small turkeys or turkey breasts to be redeemed at Weis Market. On November 25, clients were given sides of corn, green beans, pumpkin mix, cranberry sauce, mixes of mashed potatoes, stuffing, and gravy. Martin's Pastry donated 90 packs of dinner rolls and will also make a \$225 donation. The local Boy Scouts donated 15 boxes of non-perishable food, and the Franklin Fire Company on West King Street donated 3 boxes of canned goods. These donations of food, coupled with cash donations from our congregants, really helped to increase our inventory when we faced high demand due to the funding disruptions for SNAP and WIC benefits.

We are very grateful for the in-kind food and cash donations from our congregation that enable us to help meet the food insecurity of our Franklin County low-income families.
